Standards and the EU Referendum

What you need to know

- BSI is the route for UK experts to contribute to the development of British, European and international standards, through the work of its 1200 national committees.
- 95% of British standards are also European or international standards (and frequently both).
- BSI's standards are voluntary and developed by consensus. They may be codes, guides or specifications.
- The model for European standards is that of a single standard for any given topic or application, which is adopted identically as a national standard in 33 countries (already a broader membership than just the EU). Any national standards for the same topic are withdrawn.
- This model supports companies' access to the entire European market, and makes for a simpler market structure across Europe. It also means that UK experts have significant influence on the development of those standards that are used throughout Europe.
- For BSI, the current position is business as usual: BSI remains a full member of the European standards bodies CEN and CENELEC.
- While the UK's departure from the EU will require a new relationship between the UK
 and the European single market, BSI's ambition post-"Brexit" is to continue as a full
 member of CEN and CENELEC, maintaining the single standard model in the UK, as in
 the other 32 CEN and CENELEC member countries.
